Department of Mathematics & Computer Sciences, School of Basic Sciences, Babu Banarasi Das University, Lucknow announces a one-day Students' Seminar on the 'Role of Mathematics in Real Life Problem' to be held on 8 March, 2019 in Akhilesh Das Gupta Auditorium. All the students of B.Sc. (Hons.) and M. Sc. Programs enrolled in the School of Basic Sciences are eligible to participate in the Seminar. The participants shall be required to give a presentation of 10 minutes duration on a topic relevant to theme of the Seminar. The presentations shall be judged by a Panel of Judges consisting of senior faculty members and the two best presentations shall be awarded First and Second Prizes, however, a participation certificate shall be awarded to all participants.

Guidelines for Presentation

1. All presentation should be prepared using MS Office Power Point or a similar tool.
2. Presentation should be precise (accurate) and concise (short), with minimum possible slides.

3. The first slide should show the Title of presentation, Name of presenter and the Program in which he/she is enrolled. It is advisable that the second slide of the presentation should contain an outline of the presentation.
4. Presentation slides should contain the presentation contents written in bullet form, not complete sentences. Include 5-6 points per slide. Wordiness should be avoided, use key words and phrases only. Presenter is expected to concentrate on audience on what he/she is discussing/ presenting.
5. Use different size fonts e.g. Title 36, Text 28 and subsequent 24. Minimum font size will be 18. CAPITALIZE only when necessary.
6. Use a standard font like Times New Roman or Arial. Don't use a complicated font.
7. Use a color of font that contrasts sharply with the background of slides. e.g. blue font on white background. Use only 2 to 3 colors for different points, if necessary. Keep the same background consistently throughout the presentation
8. Give readable numbers to all the slides of presentation on the bottom.
